RULES.

- 1. That the Club be named "THE HUNTER'S HILL HARRIER AND FOOTBALL CLUB," its objects being the pursuit of Amateur Athletics generally.
- 2. The annual subscription be 54., payable at the commencement of season (a 2s. 6d. call, if necessary).
- 3. That all members shall be Amateurs, as defined by the N.S.W. Amateur Athletic Asso-
- 4. That the management of the Club shall be vested in the Captains, Secretary, Treasurer, As-Secretary, Delegate, and one Committeeman (four of whom shall form a quorum at any meeting thereof), who shall be elected by ballot.
- 5. That any person wishing to join the Club must be nominated by a member before the Committee proceed with election.
- 6. That all entries for Club Handicaps shall be made, and the entrance fee paid, at least five days before the day fixed for the race entered for, such entries being made to the Secretary; no member will be handscapped unless this rule is complied with.

- 7. That the pack, when out for a run, shall be under the sole control of the Captain, or, in his absence, a deputy appointed by the Committee; and any member behaving in an ungentlemanly manner shall be reported by the Captain or his deputy to the Committee, who shall proceed at the next meeting to punish him by fine or dismissal as in their discretion may seem desirable. This rule shall be strictly adhered to.
- 8. That all members must wear the Club's uniform, viz., navy blue whole costume.
- 9. That should occasion arise, a requisition signed by not less than six members, setting forth the proposed action, may summon a General Meeting of the Club (a quorum to consist of nine members), seven clear days to be given to each member.
- 10. That the rules cannot be altered except at a General Meeting (a quorum to consist of nine members), but the Committee may frame such regulations as they may deem necessary.
- 11. That the Rugby Rules be strictly adhered to in all Football matches.



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Despite four teams reaching the semi-finals, two to the grand finals and one premiership, 1982 signalled the end of our 'Golden Era'. However, every member of the club should feel proud. We did it hard! The victories didn't come as easy, the injuries were more numerous and more serious and we still managed to achieve the above.

I know that many other clubs would be grateful to achieve only what we achieved this year, but we are not 'other clubs' and once you've been to the top, it is hard to accept anything less. We are far from being a spent force in this competition, in fact we have most of the ingredients to continue the success of the past five years. With a strong Management Committee, a dedicated and enthusiastic Social Committee, a fair and unbiased Selection Committee, we only need one other thing... good young players.

It is time we as a club reassessed our position, our attitude and our direction in an endeavour to ensure the future success of our great club. Perhaps because we have had the same nucleus of players for the past five years, young players in search of a club feel we are a 'closed shop' and look elsewhere. Each one of us should make an effort to attract them to Hunters Hill.

An overall policy should be formulated to achieve this. There has been a lot of discussion about an overseas trip at the end of the 1983 season. Personally I am in favour of this. Because of the great financial success of the Social Committee over the past couple of years, the club could be basically self-sufficient for the 1983 season, leaving nearly all money raised to subsidise the trip. A lot of discussion and thought should go into the destination and the fund raising should be undertaken by all those intending to go, not just the Social Committee.

Discussion has been underway for sometime with Council regarding the lighting situation at Boronia Park. Council approve in principle the need for improved lighting, but owing to a lack of funds they feel the project may be still some time away.

Following a meeting between the executive of your committee and the Mayor and Council engineer, it was agreed that a sizeable donation from the Club (\$2000) may well facilitate the project being completed by the commencement of the 1983 season. The Committee decided that the improvement of the lighting was of the highest priority, and should Council undertake the project in view of the Club's donation, we may well have the standard of lighting we have been wanting for so long.

To the members of the Management Committee my thanks for their time and effort. To Roscoe, a special vote of thanks. Despite a serious injury during the season he managed to cope with his role while giving directions from his hospital bed. It is not true that Roscoe is taking an overseas trip on the money raised from the tennis night.

To the four coaches who with Geoff Forster made up the Selection Committee, thank you once again for your thankless task, which you performed without fear or favour.

To Johnno, the victorious Whiddon coach, and to those who played in the team throughout the year, Congratulations. They were favourites all year and they played as a team and deserved their victory. Maybe it was Johnno's mild, democratic manner 'Shut your face or I'll smack you in the mouth'.

To Alan, Brunno and Ike, the Committee and the players thank you for your dedication and we all wish we could have brought home the cups for you.

This season was again a great success socially and financially. Three revues, improved canteen facilities, numerous functions all contributed to a record profit. Naturally there are several people to thank. Malcolm Baird and Grant Millard who with Ralph and the numerous other helpers are truly the Social backbone of the Club. To the licensees of our unofficial clubhouse, Ted and Alison Polly, words cannot adequately express our gratitude. Naturally there are many others who have worked behind the scenes contributing in their own way to the many successful and enjoyable functions. While running the risk of probably forgetting a few, there are some who need mention — Paul & Sandra Bryan, Jonesy, The Pearce's, The Ellis's, John the Pom, Clem and others.

It has been noticeable that behaviour at some functions this year has been questionable. It may bell be suggested that the reason for the decline in the numbers of wives and girlfriends attending functions could be attributed to this factor. Food for thought!

I will be suggesting a restructure of the Management Committee at the Annual General Meeting. I fell this alteration, if passed, will enable a more efficient and effective Management Committee.

I do hope that those of you who are considering standing for positions, assess your suitability for that position and don't be trapped into a situation you didn't really want in the first place.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

However, special thanks is certainly due to Tim Hughes who spent six hours sitting on the sideline attending our injured players for every match of the season. Words cannot express the players' debt to you, Tim. Thanks, mate.

The club's future is not in doubt. But I would ask all of you to make a special effort for 1983. Get out and find a piayer or two and bring them along to play with the bent club in sub-district. Get yourselves fit and enjoy the game they play in heaven.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The current year saw the Social Committee surpass itself once again in its revenue earning ability. For this I thank on behalf of the entire club Malcolm Baird and Grant Millard in particular but certainly all other persons who devoted their time in helping out.

In the same vain I would like to thank the Vice-Presidents and other Stalwarts of the Club for their continued support both financially and personally for without this dedicated and loyal brigade we would be, just another club.

You will notice that the success of the Social Committee did not directly reflect itself in the Balance Sheet. Total Assets at 30.9.81 were \$20,650 but at 30.9.82 total assets had grown to only \$21,596.57 + \$2,770.61 (Soc.Committee) = \$24,367.18

This phenomena has not been brough about because of mismanagement or fraud or anything of this nature. In the main it has been brought about by the accounting system used. It is for this reason that the management committee has asked me to outline details of exactly what the Statement of Receipts and Payments purports to show.

This statement sets out only those payments and receipts made in the period 1st October, 1981 to 30th September, 1982 — no more and no less. In order to verify this the member may agree the closing cash figure from the previous year, i.e. as at 30.9.81 to the opening cash figure this year, add on all receipts and deduct all payments for the current year to arrive at a figure which represents available cash at 30th September, 1982, that being: \$978.82 + \$2,770.61 (Soc.Com.) = \$3,749.43

The statement is not a profit report. To understand why the success of the Social Committee has not been reflected in our Balance Sheet, we must consider two factors: —

Firstly we made purchases during the year of "capital items" such as T-shirts for which we still have stocks — the asset: stock not having been included in our Balance Sheet. But we shall reap the benefit of their sale in future accounting periods. Secondly we have the problem of a non-matching of "revenue" receipts and payments. If you care to look at the payment for Presentation Night in the Statement — this payment relates to the 1981 presentation night of which all relevant receipts were reported in the year ended 30.9.81, thus it is clear that the receipt and expenditure did not match up in the one year, the result being an overstatement of cash last year and an understatement this year.

The above has only been a brief attempt to explain the meaning of the club's financial statement, although it may appear on the surface to be inadequate I do not advocate any departure because the adoption of an accrual based system would necessarily mean that the office of Treasurer would have to be filled by an accountant which may not always be possible.

Anyway, moving away from this theoretical accounting discussion I would like to make mention of one other point. More so this year than any other I have come across the practice by more than a minority of the members to attend the various club functions on a "buy now pay later" basis. It never was and never will be a policy of this club to finance functions in this manner. Not only is the problem a financial one but just take a moment to consider the amount of time which various committee members spend following up outstanding debts, examples being the Annual Ball and the Sub-District Dinner — if this was not a necessary task, those committee members would be able to devote more of their limited time to make the club run more smoothly for the benefit of all members. Finally, for the 3rd year in succession it is my recommendation that players fees remain at \$30 but that associate fees be increased to \$10 to cover administrative costs.

Many thanks to the committee and all the members for their support of me during another great year with the club.
