It may be debated but as the vice chair of the senior club, who many would consider well placed to comment, put a case forward to the exceptional crowd that attended this year's seniors presentation, season 2011 can arguably go down as the best year Hunters Hill Rugby has experienced.

The full array of achievements and awards the senior club has achieved this year, I'm sure will be highlighted in the senior clubs report but for many, winning the second division club championship and our return to Kentwell Cup and first division "subbies" rugby next year, is the crowning glory. Winning "The Cowboy Cup", awarded to the club with the most points achieved across all grades and all subbies competition, was cream on the cake and fantastic achievement for the club in its own right. First grades dominant grand final victory adding additional lustre to a great year. Besides first grades dominance of their competition, the competitiveness of our teams across all grades this year will hold us in good stead going forward. Special mention to colts and thirds who can consider themselves exceptionally unlucky not to have delivered more silverware to the club this year. To all players, coaches and support crew a fantastic achievement to one and all.

It is possibly the exception rather than the norm when grand plans are put forward, that they are achieved accordingly. When the talk was that Hunters Hill Rugby would be back in Kentwell cup in three years, I'm sure many thought this was the stuff of pipe dreams. But the fact is that it was very close to being achieved in 2010 and that it was achieved this year and the way it has been achieved, the seniors chairman can take a fair amount of credit for. He has been ably supported by his committee as well as the coaching and support crew but Rod's has resourced and motivated everyone along the journey the senior club has taken and when signs of fatigue showed, it has been his energy and enthusiasm for the job that has fuelled the fire. I'm sure his own enthusiasm for the job may have waned if not for the support his family have given him and the club.

Well aware of what that winning feeling does for a club, another highlight of the year were the home days at Boronia. Strong crowd support and well run "special" event days created added vibrancy around the club this year. Special thanks to those who helped with events and for the off-field support our teams received.

The junior club continues to roll on. While overall rego numbers were steady, the club managed to field increased number of teams across both mini (U6 to U9) and Sydney Junior Rugby (U10-U12) competitions. The most pleasing result was a significant increase in mini teams which augurs well for future growth. The vast majority of teams the club fielded in SJRU competitions found themselves contesting semi-finals and come grand final day, 2 of 5 teams playing came out on top.

In 2011 the junior club made a bold decision to move their district affiliation to Northern Suburbs Junior District, essentially this meant our junior rep pathway now lead to Norths. Northern Suburbs rep teams now infused with Hunters Hill Juniors recorded their strongest ever rep campaign, with U11, U12 teams contesting finals, U13s undefeated and U15s, state champions. It should also be acknowledged that the U16 Gordon state championship winning team had Hunters Hill boys littered throughout. Hunters Hill boys featured in the Sydney U15 rep team and NSW U16 and NSW U16 Schools sides. It is most pleasing to attend GPS Rugby games and recognise Hunters Hill boys featuring prominently while playing first, second and 16A rugby. The junior club has forged an association with our neighbouring school, St Josephs College over the last few years and the focus of this association is to engage "Joeys" boys with Hunters Hill Rugby. From that association, seniors chairman Rod Salmon was recently invited to address the 2011 rugby class at Joey's. It is hope that along with our juniors, a flow of "Joeys" old boys may find their way to Boronia Park to play footy, ensuring strong playing numbers for the senior club in years to come.



The junior club is one of Sydney most vibrant and has a well earned reputation for its support of junior rugby, administration of the game and support of rep programs through coaching and managing. The club has fostered and is supported by a club membership with a fantastic volunteering ethic. More importantly since 1997, the junior club has forged a strong presence in the local community, with a key endeavour to offer rugby to kids of all size, skill levels and abilities right through till older age groups. This becoming a greater challenge in face of our kids commitments to school rugby.

The Cats. What can we say. They have sunned themselves contentedly this winter, happy to bask in the shared glory of the senior club. Previous winter's of discontent, where rumblings and disgruntlement were often heard from "the slab", just distant memories. Tradition dictates that grand embellishment of past deeds and games were still discussed but even Deckers super natural powers of pending gloom and disaster failed to rain on the Boronia parade.

The Cats were once again admirably lead by Chairman Meow and lent some great support to the senior club. Special mention to the likes of Mike Keating for both his physical and financial support of special projects. Cats chair Gary Lane and club stalwart Russ Kershler gave great on-field support, while Bairdy and Hibbo were behind the scenes with the 85kg boys. And there was a loyal contingent of grumpy old guys that regularly turned up at home and some that travelled to support. Great to see Brian "Darkie" Robertson's over-due life membership being awarded at years start and of course a season would not be the same without the presence of Angry moving along the sidelines, very much the keeper of the flame.

As I write, work has begun and in full swing on the clubs Boronia No 3 project, with every expectation that the start of season 2012 will see a fine new rugby oval at Boronia. This will not just give the club access to more playing resources and secure access to Boronia Park for rugby but can also be viewed as an important stage in the overall development of a community facility located in the precinct that will support and be a great asset to HHRUFC. There has been a number of club members working proactively to get this project over the line, Rod Salmon and Ian Kellaway to name a couple but the board would also like to acknowledge the work of Dave Sanders, who got involved at a time that saw the project through some important stages.

On behalf of the board of HHRUFC, I would like thank all those that contributed to what was a very good year for Hunters Hill Rugby. Looking forward, the senior club faces some stiff challenges in moving back to its rightful place amongst "subbies" top clubs. But if the way they have fought their back from third division not so long ago is any indication, I think we can not only survive being back in Kentwell but prosper as well.

Chairman's Report - Seniors 2011

Season 2011 proved to be the trilogy in the fantastic story of the resurgence of Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club and the end of the climb back to Division 1 and the opportunity to now be able to compete for the Kentwell Cup.

We started the season with a year of 'local' knowledge of the nature of Division 2 and we knew what it would take to win it having gone so tantalisingly close in 2010.

Our goal of winning the Division 2 Championship quickly took momentum as we clean swept the Kings Old Boys Club at their old boys ground. This happened after a rather shaky start to the season when most of our 2010 backline did not return for the 2011 season for a range of different reasons. There was certainly some chin rubbing occurring in the selection meetings in the pre-season games. The depth of the clubs recruitment and development as well as our past seasons reputations became evident as we strung together a very impressive first grade team from the first competition game.

The Committee had set a goal to improve the level of coaching at the club and to this end it was decided to recruit a trainer/coach to the ranks who could impart their knowledge onto the other coaches within the club. Alex Larkin, who has a very impressive CV of past coaching and training appointments, joined the club in February to take on the role to up-skill the whole of the club. Alex works as a full time Director of Rugby and coach at the Westfield's High School, so in effect he is coaching rugby full time. His addition to the club and subsequent appointment as 1st Grade coach with our long time coach of Peter Allan was a terrific pairing that of course went on to take the Barraclough Cup in September. I think that most of us will remember the game at David Phillips field in the Major Semi when we ran up against Briars, a team we had never beaten in two seasons. When we up 42 - Nil with ten minutes to go we had all realised we had witnessed one of the most streamlined and well drilled teams that the club had seen for decades. All the season's work from players and coaches alike had crescendoed into a truly amazing display of rugby (I just wish somebody had videoed that day!!).

The 1st Grade story was repeated all the way down the grades with every grade making the Semi Finals and we certainly had every chance of having all teams in the Grand Finals. 2nd Grade had been the donor team all year to the 1st Grade squad and I must thank Andy Harvey for the way he accepted losing his key players on Thursday night training to 1st Grade. Somehow 2nd Grade would then bounce back with some rather interesting reshuffles to produce regular wins on the Saturday.

3rd Grade had a rather shaky start, as there was basically some sort of void in the space that meant it was difficult to name a team and then have enough players to get a serious training session going. Steve Turner persevered and after mixed results in the first half of the season they went on to go through the second half of the season undefeated. It was only a penalty goal after the full time in the grand final that denied the team the Blunt Cup.

Our 4thGrade coach Dave Polly as always seemed to keep putting wins on the board. When asked to name a team on Thursday for the selection board he would give that trademark smirk and say I have no idea what the team will be until 30 minutes before the game on Saturday. Never the less the team was always impressive and the players had years and years and years of experience so a game of rugby was something they could do with their eyes closed. When they finished the season with a record 53 - Nil win against Blacktown you definitely got the feeling that they could certainly win the Richardson Cup. Alas in the Final they went down 8 to 7 to Forest and that ended the season for a very talented team.

The Colts boys wanted to go back-to-back Premiers this year and with an unbelievable season of record results including being undefeated Minor Premiers, it was a pleasure to watch these boys each week. Mal Fraser and Matt Porter did an excellent job with the team and to see them go down by a conversion from the sideline after the full time siren was devastating for the entire club. Congratulations to all for a very memorable season and one that will stay on the record books for years to come.



Under 85's were Grand Finalists and put together a super season with some very entertaining rugby. The "Hillies Lites" as they have become known have been a very important part of the club allowing an opportunity for players to enjoy a mid week game when they might otherwise have not played rugby at all. Paul Shields' passion is the reason these guys get a game of rugby at all as his tireless recruiting and working as coach and carer is miraculous. His right hand man in Hibbo makes for a formative and effective team.

Our Mighty 5th Grade continued to turn up for a game each week and had an enjoyable and successful season even though the score sheet might not have always indicated this. Viren and Nathan somehow put together a team more often than not and all of the players had a great time.

Bruce Robinson returned this year as Club Coach and it is without doubt that our success over the last few years has been largely due to the professional approach that "Robbo" has instilled across the club. His service is much appreciated and I am sure he will be back in 2012 to rack up wins in Division One.

I would like to thank the committee for a slick and streamlined job this year. Special mention must go to my right hand man, Ron White, who does an amazing amount of work, week in and week out. His tireless work in getting programs, statistics and annual reports done always amazes me. The club owes him a great debt for his many, many years of volunteering.

Renny as always makes the Registrar job look easy as there is never an issue that finds its way to the committee meetings as Renny has covered all bases before the ball is even in play.

Max Marraffa, the moneyman, was excellent and has learnt a lot about the MYOB accounting package this year. Tim V was a great secretary; Jordan was stoic in his role as general committeeman. Ewan was superb at the job of ground manager, and another tireless season from Dave Weston in PR with the club receiving more press this year after massive coverage last year.

Steve Turner was unbelievable in the many different and varied roles he took on. I am sure he is not going to take on jersey cleaning in 2012. I will miss our regular chats on the best way to remove dirt, grime and blood from jerseys. We often sounded like we were making an OMO commercial.

Once again the web site was the conduit that kept the club fully informed and I know we are the envy of many clubs and that is all thanks to Andy Ball who does a marvellous job keeping it updated and improving the features.

Paul Shields continues to be one of the hardest workers in the club with a mobile phone and texting bill that is off the scale. He never stops recruiting and is instrumental as to why we have such a great number of players coming to the club.

Canteen was a great success this year with Natasha, Danielle and Cheree making the job of feeding and quenching everybody seem effortless. We even got beetroot occasionally this year as well as tomato and lettuce. They are promising even more improvements next year.

Ladies Day was looked after by Jordan Butler and Sue Roach and with addition of Moet & Chandon Methode Champenoise being added to the bar list meant for an entertaining afternoon. It was a huge success and will certainly be hard to beat.

Our tourists added enormously to the club with their enthusiasm and skill making a positive impact in many areas of the club. Dave Watkins added a power and strength around the park and off the field and he would happily drive the bus or the gear Pajero to and from the ground. Ben McKinnell was not only terrific on the field but also coached the under 18's on Sunday and Wednesday meaning that he only had Mondays off from the club. James Lindfield returned half way through the season and made an immediate impact both on and off the field. Johnny Apulu was one of the best on the field at the halfback spot often making breaks from nowhere to score or set up many tries.



As we head to Division One in 2012 I am very confident that we will be a club that will surprise a lot of the regular 1st Division clubs. There is a lot of history that will be retold from the days when we were a regular Div One club. Now we have made it back to Div One we can look forward to many, many years ahead of playing Kentwell Cup.

This year we had a unique situation, which had probably never been done before and will never be done again, where players from the same club played against each other in the NSW Suburban v NSW Country representative match.

For the first time in 8 years has Hunters Hill had a player in the senior rep side, this year we had two in opposing teams, Lani Kaiwai became the 65th player in the last 100 years to represent Hunters Hill for the Sub District Rugby Union. Lani was selected on the wing that night and had a solid game apart from the audacious drop goal attempt in his outstanding debut season.

Tim Walton came from Newcastle Hunter and was obviously selected for country whilst playing there however he came to Hunters Hill while playing for country and made the team on the wing v NSW Suburban, for interest NSW Subbies won the match 18-16.

Congratulations to both players and may both continue to represent Hunters Hill in the future.

A fantastic year, in terms of results and achievements, and promotion back to 1st Division has been my goal upon returning. To do it within 5 years and with the club in good health and room for growth with the juniors, and good prospects for the future with ground developments and people wanting to be part of Hunters Hill Rugby, makes me proud and happy to be associated with the club.

- * 18 wins from 18 games to claim the minor premiership undefeated.
- * A bonus point for scoring four tries or more in 16 of those 18 games.
- * 815 points scored in a season a Hunters Hill Colts record.
- * 544 points for & against differential a Hunters Hill Colts record.
- * 22 games undefeated (including the back end of the premiership winning 2010 season) a Hunters Hill Colts record.

Confidence spilled over to arrogance. The attitude among a core group of players was less than perfect, especially at training which translated into the games.

I thought the first loss would be enough to shock the team into focus. But no. We got a soft on when the other mob were barring up. The dream of back-to-back premierships was not to be. Still, they were a good bunch of lads and it was a great season.

Congratulations to Best & Fairest and Best Forward Kerry, what a talent! To Best Back and Players Player Paul Ah Lam and Most Improved Player Taukari Wood, who became something of a revelation on the side of the scrum. Special mention to the blockbusting Ah Lam twins, John who topped the tryscoring stats with 17 and Dave, 2nd on 14. To captain fantastic Sean Roger, who has developed into a great prospect at the base of the scrum and who led by inspirational example. To Ricky Kucia for his skill and enthusiasm. To Hugh Smith who made a great fist of converting from flanker to prop, without complaint. To Latu Havea and Tala Semu for some powerful cameos. To Scotty for his class on and off the field. To Kells for getting the team and club on Prime Time TV news for his magnificent Beyond Blue initiative. To Cossie for never missing a training and for sticking it up his old Forrest outfit with a bagful of tries. And for Pauly Metusela for such brilliant, brutal consistency. Perhaps the greatest achievement of the 2011 Colts will be realized in years to come as their talents stay around the club to filter through the grades.

3rd Grade Blunt Cup Report 2011

This season just finished was extremely enjoyable. It's been a pleasure to be associated with a great group of players who cultivated such a great team environment.

I hadn't quite realised the magnitude of the challenge in coaching 3rd grade, but soon became aware that creating a settled team that could develop combinations and understanding was going to be a difficult task. Good form by a player would often result in him being promoted to a higher grade or being selected to play Colts. At times the Thursday night team sheet looked like Swiss cheese and there were many, many online discussions as well as the inevitable negotiating around the dreaded whiteboard. Fortunately we were able to keep a core group of talented and experienced players upon which to build the core of our team. Their attitudes were exemplary in terms of what best suited the team and it played an important role in our progress.

Our season started well, with an impressive away victory over Kings Old Boys. This match saw the Hunters Hill debuts of James Hannam and Joel Brooks, two players who would go on to make significant contributions in 1st/2nd Grade and Colts respectively.

The next few weeks proved to be a challenging time, with wins over Newport and Forest, losses to Hornsby, Briars and UNSW, as well as a scrappy and bad tempered draw against Oatley. The Wednesday following the Oatley match I made the first of the season's two trips to the Judiciary at Moore Park. The Uni loss was a real watershed for us. Very basic errors, poor communication and a complete disregard for the game plan saw us punished by the students, who gave us a lesson in patience, simplicity and the rewards associated with a good kicking game.

Despite that loss I felt we had the basis of a good team, especially since a number of players had enjoyed a premiership with 2nds/Colts the year before, In addition we had some talented new boys, who were improving with each outing. It was at about this time that Paul Shields began to help out and his contribution was to become significant. Our original Co Coach Lewis Nottidge had become a casualty because of work pressures and his replacement Andy Johnson, duly found himself in 2nd grade. Such are the rewards of being 'King of the Set Piece' Andy © Shieldsy attacked his brief with all his usual relish and enthusiasm and together with West Harbour recruit Eric Coombs, helped create an attacking attitude among the forwards, which was to prove telling as the second half of the season progressed.

The week following the humbling loss to Uni we were drawn to play the competition leaders St Ives, at home. Our season to that point looked like this: - 3 wins, 3 losses, 1 draw. Needless to say were not expected to contribute to the Club Champ points on that day. Despite a forgettable first half, a yellow card and being 3-12 down at the break, our fortunes began to turn, as we piled on two tries and a conversion to take the match 15-12. Suddenly a snapshot of what we were capable of. Confidence and attitude became the strong characteristics of 3rd grade after that game. Our training became very focused, our will firmed and our sense of belief saw us dominate the second half of the Blunt Cup with 10 consecutive wins, before drawing with Blacktown in the final round. Chairman's Report - Juniors 2011

It is generally a cliché to start a season report with "oh what a season", but I truly think that 2011 will be seen as one of the Club's most significant in our recent history. Not only did we have success on the paddock, but we made some key decisions and changes that not only affected our own Club, but also had implications for the structure of junior rugby within the Sydney metropolitan area.

At the beginning of the year, before a ball was kicked in anger, the Juniors' committee undertook to address the issue of our district affiliation – which had been put forward for discussion over a number of years by recent committees. The issue was fairly simple – we were looking for more equitable opportunities for our players to participate in representative sides. Gordon District had grown so large that it represented 25% of all juniors playing rugby in the Sydney Metropolitan area – Thus by sheer weight of numbers it was difficult for any club within the district to get a fair share of the small number of Rep spots available.

After an extensive consultation process it was decided to move our affiliation to the Norths Junior District, with Mosman, Drummoyne and Norths. The basis of the decision was to get more opportunities in Rep rugby for our players, and we felt that Norths could become a very strong and competitive district with our inclusion. The change in the juniors landscape after our move meant that Gordon Districts numbers fell back to below 20% of all players and Norths moved up to around 13% of total numbers. We would be judged on this decision come the State Championships in June.

The other big decision for 2011 was our commitment to get behind the fledgling Inner West Minis competition and help to expand the junior rugby footprint into the Inner West. We committed one team in each age group (U6-U9) to add some weight of numbers and then (as there are no formal "competitions" at this age) rotated our teams between the Gordon-Norths minis and the Inner West



minis. From all reports our teams really enjoyed the chance to play teams they normally wouldn't play and it certainly enhanced the experience for our minis players and their families.

So into the season we went. Our numbers looked strong once again, as registrations rolled in and with the implementation of the new ARU pathway program – we actually saw a rise in total numbers of teams we would field in 2011. In the end we had 14 minis teams and 18 competition teams donning the "Black and White". With the usual preparation of another successful pre-season camp at a very wet Narrabeen Sports centre, a huge Gala day at Boronia and the always popular Season launch at the Hunters Hill Club – we were ready for some rugby.

As far as the competition teams went we had a fantastic year with 16 of 18 teams making it into semi-finals – 13 of which were competing in the major or CUP finals series. Five of these teams also took out the minor premiership (U10D, U11E, U12A, U13C Red, U13E). From the semi finals series we had three teams compete in the Plate Grand Finals, two of which won (U10A and U14B) and six teams made the Cup Grand Finals, with the U11E and U13E teams taking out premierships for 2011. Congratulations to these and all teams for a fine season. Boronia Park was again host to Grand Finals this season and many thanks to all that contributed to making it a successful day.

2011 also saw the second year of the Joeys relationship in the U13 and U14 age groups – needless to say both the club and the school learnt a lot from the initial year and I am please to say that this season saw the relationship blossom into what we know it can be. The highlight was a clash between the U13 Red and U13 White teams on Joeys No.1 Oval in the last round, which was a fight for the minor premiership.

The other main part of the season for the club was the Representative program – as a transition between Gordon and Norths it was agreed that the U16's would stay with Gordon to play out their last year and the rest of the age groups would move to Norths immediately. I am pleased to say that our decision paid benefits immediately as 82 of our players were selected in various Rep teams in 2011. This is a massive jump in numbers to last year and part justification of the decision to move. The other factor was obviously would we now become cannon fodder or would we compete?

The answer to this was beyond our expectations. Norths sides made the Grand Final of the State Championships in the U11's, U12's and U15's (whom won State Champs), while our U13's side was undefeated yet still missed out on semis due to the draw. And the Gordon U16's side, which was dominated by Hunters Hill lads, also played in the Grand Final and won the State Champs. So Hunters Hill had 4 teams play in State Championships Grand Finals and another side undefeated, which is surely sweet justification for the move. I'd like to thank the Norths District folks for their warm welcome and look forward to building on this massive start to our relationship.

Rounding off the season was a pleasing Referee course which saw 42 attendees from our club -6 of these going on to referee some minis games before the season completed. It is great to see so many of our club looking to get involved and give back to the game. I look forward to their progress next season.

None of this could be achieved without the support of a wonderful committee whom are keen and dedicated towards the Club and bettering the rugby experience for all. I thank each and every one of them for their efforts this season. Equally our canteen girls that keep the club fed and watered during the year, under the guidance of Bonnie and Kylie also need congratulating on their efforts.

Lastly the assistance given to us by Hunters Hill Council, Mayor Sue Hoopmann and the grounds staff at Boronia Park has been excellent and we are always in their debt for aiding us in our endeavours each season.

INNER WEST MINIS

An indication of the high regard our club is held in, we were asked by NSW Rugby to attend a meeting to look at the feasibility of the setting up of a mini rugby competition (U6 to U9) to service Sydney's Inner West. Myself and fellow committee member Ian Kellaway accepted an invite to attend. No one in Sydney Junior circles more knowledgeable when it comes to minis rugby and its administration than Kell. It was clear from the outset that junior clubs in Sydney's Inner West were struggling, much of that to do with access to a local competition for younger players. At the end of the meeting it was also clear that without Hunters Hill teams, the viability of the competition was questionable. We gave an undertaking to the meeting that we would look at supporting the competition in some way but indicated our club would have to retain some commitment to our traditional minis competition playing other clubs in Sydney's north.

Upon being able to confirm our support with a number of teams to an Inner West Minis Competition, (IWMC) it became quickly evident that it would require more than us supplying teams to ensure it viability. The fact is that while agreement had been reached to set up a competition and a venue offered to host, there was no other plans in place. The majority of those involved were doing their best just to run their clubs and had little idea of what was required to set up and run a junior rugby competition. It was quickly recognised that unless we got involved and offered our experience and knowledge as well as Hunters Hill resources the competition would struggle to get established. Kell generously offered to chair the IWMC committee and act as its competition manager. The end result was that the IWMC was an outstanding success by any standard. The feedback from clubs and parents was exceptionally positive. Australian Rugby personal, reported back to head office that essentially IWMC had established a template for what a well run mini competition should be, admittedly from a

small base and that a solid foundation has been laid for the future growth of this competition. But most importantly, rugby as a sport is now available to kids in an area once void of playing options. Hunters Hill was widely acknowledged for its support of this initiative by both the ARU and NSW Rugby development departments. That acknowledgment is nice but HHJRUFC is a well run, well resourced and established club. For rugby and junior rugby to flourish in a competitive junior sporting environment, it will only occur if those in a position to help, do so and continue to foster the rugby brotherhood.

The Archive Committee (TAC) continued its work to faithfully capture the Club's rich history.

The Committee, comprised of Bruce Lycett, Terry Laundry, Ron White, John Hibbert, Colin Laundry, Allan Southcombe and myself, met weekly during the season.

Our activity during 2011 has been to progressively identify and sort the large amount of hardcopy material passed to us. This includes newspaper cuttings, magazines, previous Club records including Minutes and match reports, player statistics and earlier photos not previously held.

We also commenced research into the Club's formative years and to capture match results from that period. Our search has identified our earliest reference to date to the Club in the Sydney Morning Herald dated 27 May 1892, which reported a match between St Ignatius' College F.C and Hunters Hill F.C. The match was played under Rugby Rules at Riverview on Queen's Birthday – hence the date in May not June – and resulted in " ... a win for the collegians by eight points to nil."

We also held an exhibition at Boronia Park during the season, of material focused on the 1971, 1981, 1991 and 2001 teams.

We have also completed the imaging of all known team photos for both Juniors and Seniors and have captured all the players names.

We have met with and interviewed former players, administrators and supporters to capture a visual record of the Club and its personalities and to hear from them their personal perspectives.

Our future activity will focus on continuing to capture and record the more significant hard copy material, continue with our video recordings and to research the early history for more results and other information. Our aim is to be able to make this material available to all via the Club's website, and to occasionally provide excerpts from the records which show and capture the challenges and successes the Club has faced over the years.

I want to extend my thanks to my friends on the Committee for their enthusiasm and commitment in what is a very enjoyable and satisfying activity.





