CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT – SEASON 2013

Much can happen in a year and our Club experienced both highs and lows during 2013.

The seniors' season results were disappointing and led to the Club being relegated to Division 2 in 2014. Renny Iles' report will cover this in more detail but I believe there are lessons to be learned:

- The Club has been most successful when it has had capable, and enthusiastic Committees working as a team and with clear and defined roles
- Whilst an individual might have tremendous passion and commitment, the Club is never likely
 to survive an environment where other members of the Committee are not given the
 opportunity to develop and be involved
- Whilst Suburban Rugby is about rugby "played for the game itself", Club Committees must have strong governance as well as transparency with all processes and transactions.

To Renny and his Committee, I want to thank you for your efforts in a very hard season. I just hope it hasn't knocked the enthusiasm out of you all and that you might still feel inclined and keen to continue working with the Club in some capacity.

The juniors' on field performances were again reflective of the strong body that many people have contributed to and built over the years. Ben Gregory will report on this in detail, but we can be proud of the great results achieved and the efforts of the boys chosen in the various representative teams.

To Ben and his Committee, thank you for a job well done, and you can be proud of your efforts!

Sadly, adult, off field behavioural incidents involving members of both the seniors and juniors, tarnished the Club's reputation. The Board initiated disciplinary action against a number of people and it is something I don't want to have to face again. We are a Club with proud traditions and we are much better than that.

The Golden Oldies, or CATS as they are affectionately known, had a great year on and off the field. Playing numbers increased and the loyal band of former players continued to support the Club at games through the season. Well done to TC, Gary Lane and your Committee!

The Archive Committee, led by Terry Laundry continued to faithfully capture the Club's history, and their work will be the envy of most other Clubs. This includes the great effort Ron White puts into compiling our Club's most comprehensive Annual Report. Thank you Terry and Ron and the team.

To Peter MacFarlane and his Casino Royale organising committee, a sincere thank you for the effort put into the function held in September, at the close of the season. The organising committee had a great belief that we are one club and that it would be possible to hold a successful "whole of Club" function, with the potential - but not essential - aim of a profit that could be passed to the Board to use across future whole of Club activities. The nearly 200 people who attended (and the many players and friends who provided support and labour on the night), will all testify to the success and enjoyment factor. I hope it is the beginning of regular Club functions. Perhaps the next opportunity might be the 2014 season start?

The redevelopment and returfing of Boronia Park 3 continued and expected to be completed by the time this report is tabled. This has been an extremely challenging task for the Board and is a classic example of enthusiasm getting in the road of proper project management and funding. The Board assumed direct project management for this activity in September 2012. It was evident at that point that project documentation and funding estimates were incomplete and inadequate

The juniors have very generously donated \$60,000 to this project; double their original financial commitment. With the seniors not able to make a financial contribution, the juniors' effort was critical to getting this project completed. The Board sincerely appreciates this gesture.

It is good for the Club to be closely involved in the development of facilities which we use and there is a proud history of us investing significantly in the of the Boronia Park complex. However, emotion and passion need to be replaced by discipline, financial rigour and good governance.

We have necessarily had a great deal of involvement with Councillors and staff at Hunters Hill Council, not only with regards to the normal season issues but also Boronia 3. The Board thanks in particular, the Mayor, Richard Quinn and General Manager Barry Smith, David Innes and Phil Sutton for their assistance and support.

We were saddened to lose during the season, two former men associated with the Club. Jack Johnson passed away in March 2013. In 1942 he played Under 10s with Hunters Hill and then played juniors from 1947 - 1951, after the war. During that period while playing juniors, he also played or was a reserve in several Kentwell Cup games when the seniors were short of players. During his time at Hunters Hill he was involved in the 1951 and 1955 Whiddon Cup premiership winning sides. In the late 1950's he was involved with Jack Mapledoram in getting Hunters Hill rugby going again after the Club faded for a period. He coached the Under 18's in 1968 before becoming Manager of the Whiddon Cup side in 1969. Jack recruited Peter Wood, an ex Drummoyne player, as coach. Together they worked hard to put the Senior Club back on track and were a very important factor in the 1969 Whiddon Cup, winning the Premiership.

Paul Gleeson passed away in December 2012. Paul played seniors rugby with the Club in the early 1970s and was a great Clubman and contributor off the field, as well as enjoying rugby in the lower grades.

I want to sincerely thank my Board colleagues - Andrew Rennie, Blake Walker, Michael Keating and Paul Shields - for their contribution and support during the season. In particular, Blake who has predominately managed and driven the B3 project since the Board assumed project management responsibility.

I also want to thank Gary Lane for his work as General Manager, since April 2013. Gary's efforts across the Club - have certainly eased the workload of the Board, particularly with areas such as Council liaison, and day-to-day contact with the B3 contractors. This part-time funded position, created by the Board, was enabled through a generous donation, for which the Board is very grateful.



Such are the dimensions of the Club and so wide the range of activities and responsibilities, both on and off the field, that the Board needs to look at options, including sponsorship at board level, to enable this position of General Manager to continue.

To our Club Patrons – The Hon. Joe Hockey MP, the Hon. Anthony Roberts MP and Gordon Bray – we appreciate your support and hope that we can continue our association and engagement with you.

To our Sponsors for both seniors and juniors, we sincerely appreciate your contributions, which are vital to an essentially amateur Club. We hope that the association has been of benefit to your businesses.

Hunters Hill "Mostyn & Kellaway Shields" - Eligibility

The "Andrew Mostyn" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The "Ian Kellaway" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the "Andrew Mostyn" shield becomes ineligible for the "Ian Kellaway" and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

Hunters Hill "Club Shields" - Criteria

- 1. The Shield is awarded to the team which finishes the highest in its division during the regular season ie. before commencement of play-off rounds.
- 2. In the event that two or more teams finish in the same highest position eg. first, the winner is the team that earns the maximum percentage of competition (win/draw) points which are available to them during the regular season. Note: this excludes any bonus point system. The maximum points available may vary depending on the number of teams in the competition draw therefore a review of the competition size is required to ensure that maximum points available from actual matches played ie. excluding byes, are the only ones included. (eg a team playing in a 6 team competition may play more games than a team in an 8 team competition providing the team with a greater opportunity to gain more total points). The calculation will be the number of wins (of games actually played) divided by the number of games played. Draws shall count as ½ of a win. This should be calculated as a percentage of the total points available calculated to 2 decimal places.
- 3. In the case where two or more teams obtain the same percentage of maximum points available the winner will be determined by:
- a) The team with the highest points ratio (points for divided by points against); and if still equal
- b) The team with the highest points differential from games played (points for minus points against) and if still equal
- c) If still equal then Declare the relevant team's joint winners of Shield.

Chairman's Report - Juniors 2013

There is no doubt that the 2013 has been the **BEST YEAR ON RECORD** by the junior club, achieving remarkable success on the paddock plus making further developments off the field to secure a bright future for the club.

On the field we saw such success that made us the top junior club in the Sydney Metropolitan area. The club had EIGHT team competing in Grand Finals, which is a club record, and on this basis alone 2013 will be remembered as a stellar year for the juniors. To further put this achievement Into context, we only had 17 competition teams this season - so almost 50% of our teams made it to the decider, a fantastic achievement. Our previous best was six teams making it into Grand Finals back in 2009.

But as the good people at Demtel will tell you - "but wait there's more". The club managed to secure a whopping **SIX** Premierships on the day, a magnificent achievement by anyone's reckoning.

Grand Final day started with our U11A's taking a spirited 12-5 victory over their much larger Western Raptors opponents.

Then it was the all Hunters Hill clash where the Cerise (Joeys) team was taking on the Whites. A 19-15 win in the semi-final had the Cerise team as slight favourites going in, but it was anyone's game and finished a 17 all draw despite a late effort by the whites to steal the win.



The U13A's played a large and skilled team from Blacktown,

but eventually ran away with the game 34-10. This was immediately followed by the U14A's whom had a game on their hands with a spirited Clovelly side. They too took a win 31-12 to make it consecutive victories for this team.

The U11D side was way out at Blacktown and meeting a Hornsby side that had troubled them in the past. But a 17-5 win on the big day saw them finish the season as Premiers.

The U15 Whites had to face a Mosman side which had a couple of fringe A grade players back in their team following their A grade sides demise (care of Hunters Hill mind you). And this proved to be the difference as their winger scored a treble to snatch the victory from our boys 41-12, a hard day at the office for the lads.

The last team to play was our U15A's and they met the old foe in Chatswood in a repeat of last year's Grand Final. Despite going to an early lead and looking the dominant team for most of the match, a couple of defensive lapses saw the Hunters Hill boys go down fighting to lose 17-14. The boys can be proud of a great year and they can hold their heads high.

But as we know the club Is not only about these teams that achieved Grand Final success - A number of teams made it to semi finals and Plate finals, with our U14C Whites winning their Plate Grand Final.

Another highlight was the U16 Barbarian team that saw a number of our Hunters Hill boys join with



lads from Mosman, Drummoyne and Lane Cove to form a joint venture team. This team had a very enjoyable season and only missed the semi-finals on for and against points.

Our minis had a good year transitioning between the Inner West Minis and the Gordon / Norths minis competitions. The U8 and U9 teams both attended a couple of gala days and one off matches and performed well, before culminating with the annual Dufficy Cup at Boronia Park for our U9's.

But this season saw some new additions to the club with the Ladies 7's touch rugby competition beginning. We had six teams consisting of a mixture girls and ladies from all ages playing a competition on Monday nights which spanned the entire season. For the record the Pink team were the inaugural winners. defeating the Green team in the final. Many thanks must go the Greg Wyatt-Spratt for his efforts in helping this fledgling competition find its legs.





At the end of the season we selected an U13 Rep side to play an invitational against the girls from Mosman. The evening saw us play against two Mosman teams for a win and a loss. All involved enjoyed the night and it will become an annual event.

The club also took out the inaugural Norths Junior District Club Championship in its first

year which is another reflection on the strength of our season as a club. Competition Points accumulated were multiplied by a "grade" factor (A grade = 2.0, B grade = 1.8 etc) and then divided by the number of competing teams. Thus every teams results are important in assisting a club victory in the club championship.

On the Representative front we again saw Hunters Hill dominant in team selections for the Norths Rep teams. And these teams performed admirably at the State Championships with the U11 and U12 teams both making the quarter finals, our U13's made the final of the tournament only to go down narrowly to Illawarra in the final. The U14's went all the way and won the State Championships over Randwick in the final. Our U15's were undefeated but failed to progress past the semi-finals having a 10-10 draw with eventual winners Gordon, but didn't progress on tries. The U16's had a harder year and missed out on a finals appearance.

From this carnival we saw a large number of our U14 and U15 lads make it through to the next level of Rep rugby. Seven of our U14's made it through to the Sydney Rep team to play against Country (listed below) whilst another two lads were in shadow squad or withdrew. In the U15's we saw ten of our lads make it through to selection in one of the regional rep teams (listed below), with six of these lads



making it through from there to represent Sydney vs Country. From this game they then selected a NSW team of which four Hunters Hill U15 lads made the team. Well done to all these lads.

The club saw a number of age groups take tours to such places as Hong Kong, Italy, Bowral and Canberra this season. The two overseas tours saw Hunters Hill defeat an Italian selection side and the U13's tour of Hong Kong saw our lads take on a side of U15-U18 year olds and win in style. All tours were extremely enjoyable and a great success. We hope to see more of our age groups take to touring in the years to come.

On the social front we saw good attendance from the juniors to the James Bond themed all club function. Many new



faces appeared for the Dad's Army team which took on the Cats in the annual clash that marked its fifth year this season. And the roll up at the Grand Final victory party and presentation day shows the club is well patronized.

All this stuff couldn't happen without the support of our wonderful sponsors. I would like to once again thank McGrath (John Paranchi and Tracey Dixon), Ord Minnet (Tim Gunning), Hunters Hill Clun (Steve Hannan), Advanced Audio Visuals (Frank Crotti), FDC (David Sanders), Jaycar (Gary Johnston) and East West Physio (Simon Hockings) for all their support this year. Your contributions to this club are amazing and a vital part of what we do within the club and the community. We are extremely grateful.

Lastly I need to thank the 2013 committee and age coordinators whom made this season such a success. Without the hard work by these unpaid volunteers we would not have the club in the position that it currently stands. Many of these people have given a number of years of service and to those that find themselves at the end of their "tour of duty" I would like to say thanks on behalf of everyone involved in the club.

I look forward to these changes and to Hunters Hill resuming it's rightful place as one of Subbies most respected Clubs.





HHRUFC - THE ARCHIVE COMMITTEE (TAC)

The Archive Committee are now well and truly entrenched in its Henley Headquarters.

The year has not been as productive as in previous years due to a number of reasons. Renovations at the Henley Community Rooms above our room meant that TAC had to vacate the premises for several weeks while worked was carried out. Also health problems with some of the team coupled with travels meant many missed weeks from TAC duties.

Despite all this we still managed to conduct video interviews with Michael McNamara, Peter Wood, Ian Kellaway, Andrew Skelly and Rob Helby. These interviewees cover a period of close to 50 years of Hunters Hill Rugby as players, coaches and administrators of the Club. These interviews are providing us with important information in our attempts to record the history of our Club.

This year Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club celebrated 121 years with a Back to Boronia Day on the 17 August. Once again TAC displayed photos and memorabilia from the past, featuring the 3's – 1903 to 2013. This was a chance for past players and supporters to see old teammates and relive the premierships of 1983 – Judd Cup and Whiddon Cup, Club Championship teams of 1993, Under 16 Metropolitan Northern Zone Premiers of 2003, and the inaugural Golden Oldies team of 1983. By advertising the B2B day in the local and daily newspapers we received photos and memorabilia from people who had read the articles and were kind enough to offer us items from relatives who had played or were involved in the Club. A photo of a 1903 Hunters Hill team and information re the Gammie family members who had played with the Club in the 1900s – in fact David Gammie was President in 1911, was given to us. Another kind lady came to the B2B day and offered us a photo of the 1926 2nd Grade Premiers together with the trophy that her father had won by being in the team.

We visited the Hunters Hill Historical Society to check whether they may have photos which were not in our collection. To our surprise the majority of the photos held by them had been given to them by TAC – duplicates of photos in our catalogue. We did gather some information on Charlie Fairland and Jack Mapledoram which was appreciated.

We are presently cataloguing Junior and Senior team photos for the 2013 season and reviewing yearly folders.

When TAC was established in 2009 the Committee identified one of its objectives was to record the history of the Club faithfully and accurately. With the cataloguing of team photos and historical material, video interviews with past players, officials and supporters, and Ron White producing an Annual Report each year we are partly achieving this objective.

History is the continuous methodical recording of events and is a concept describing the availability of a written record or some other form of documented communication that can be used to support a specific historical narrative. Primary sources are firsthand written evidence of history made at the time of an event by a present person. It is best done as it happens rather than endeavour to gather the facts after many years gone by. This can be fraught danger, with facts being misconstrued – depending on who you ask about an event. With this in mind we would implore the arms of the Club and the Board to provide TAC with the minutes of any meeting they may have during each year.

Again we thank the Juniors and Seniors for their generosity in sharing the cost of the lease for TACHQ. Also a thanks to Gary Lane and the Cats for providing us with the money to buy a gazebo for use at this years' B2B Day.
