CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT - SEASON 2014

2014 saw a much-improved performance on the field from our seniors and continued success from our juniors.

After a shaky start the seniors consolidated and with the Club finished a commendable fourth in the NSW Suburban Second Division Club Championship and had two teams compete in the semi finals.

Our juniors continued their strong form in recent years and had five teams make the grand finals of their groups, with three teams - 11C, 11F and 15A - winning premierships in the Sydney Junior Rugby Union competition.

The Golden Oldies enjoyed an increase in numbers – although this did not automatically convert to players – and provided great support and ample pearls of wisdom to anyone who was within earshot!

To all the players – juniors and seniors – thank you for choosing to represent our Club and for your efforts during the year. I hope the experience has been good and you will return!

The respective reports will contain more detail about the football seasons, but I want to thank Gary Lane and Greg Wyatt-Spratt (and Peter MacFarlane for his assistance with the CATS while Gary carried the roles of Chairman of both the seniors and Golden Oldies). Their commitment and leadership during the season, together with the contributions of their subcommittee members, coaches and managers was critical to the success achieved.

The Archive Committee continued its valuable work in capturing and recording our Club history. Displays of memorabilia were held on "Back to Boronia" days for both juniors and seniors and considerable time has been spent on reviewing, developing and expanding on the written Club history, using our archived records. This will ultimately be available via the Club website. Our thanks go to all the members of the Committee.

The Club experienced a decrease in playing numbers, particularly in the juniors, and anecdotally many other clubs experienced similar drops in membership. This is an issue for rugby generally.

Boronia Park 3 redevelopment was finally completed, however, the time frame for this achievement was long beyond the expected timeframe set in 2011, when the project started. Irrigation piping was installed, turf was laid, and the installation of safety fencing was all completed in time for the 2014 pre-season trials and the oval was used during the season. Our final commitment to this redevelopment was the installation of stairs in the southeast corner in October. Blake Walker continued his close engagement on this protracted exercise and we are very grateful to him for that ongoing management.

The Board of Management is well aware of our governance responsibilities as an incorporated not-for-profit association. With the cooperation of the three sub committees, all banking has been consolidated with Westpac and the Board has opened a separate account for use on "whole of club" activities.

The Board progressed development of an Administration and Procedures Manual which will be finalised by the incoming Board and will be available for incoming 2015 sub committees and which will, hopefully, help in the efficient and consistent conduct of club business. It is anticipated this will be updated yearly, or as required.

The juniors generously agreed that the traditional Season Launch would become a whole club event with the proceeds to go into the Board's account for ongoing expenses. This was a great success – financially and socially – and hosted by Gordon Bray. Our sincere thanks go to Luke McCormack and his helpers in this great initiative!

The Board is also keen to work with each of the sub committees to upgrade the Club website. This will continue into 2015.

The Board has been actively seeking funding by way of government grants (in conjunction with Hunters Hill Council), to progress further work in relation to the Boronia Park Ovals complex. The issues to be addressed include drainage and associated water harvesting, amenities and facilities for Ovals 2 and 3, and lighting for Oval 3.

Ian Kellaway again took on the role of Council Liaison and we are very appreciative of the amount of time he committed to ensure that ongoing relationships with Councillors', management and staff were productive and cordial.

We were deeply saddened to lose during the season, three men with ties to the Club.

<u>Bruce Lycett</u> - Bruce passed away on 16 October after an incredible 20-year battle with cancer. Bruce has been either a player, Committee Member, President, Coach, Team Manager and mentor to many, continuously since 1963 to present.

His achievements include:

Bruce's involvement with the Club extended over 53 of his 69 years. Our Club and indeed, the broader rugby community are significantly the better for his involvement. Bruce was a legend and an elder within our Club. He was widely regarded and respected across the NSW Suburban rugby community. He was always a team player - on and off the field - with undisputed integrity. Everything he did was with the interests of our game and the broader rugby community in mind. His contribution, passion, commitment and loyalty never waned. He was truly one of the good ones.

<u>Peter Woods</u> – Peter was a significant contributor to our Club in the late 1960s coaching our 1969 Whiddon Cup team. I had the privilege of playing in that team Premiership winning team and appreciated his mentoring and coaching. It is widely accepted that the victory in 1969 was the impetus that reinvigorated the seniors. This was evidenced by a significant growth in numbers and a number of premierships flowed in the early 1970s and beyond, from that drive.

<u>Peter Webster</u> - Peter played with the Club between 1979-1981 and played in Kentwell, Judd and Whiddon Cup teams in that period.

We were also saddened to hear that Honour Cap holder Terry Rust (a great player from the 1960s and early 70s) lost his wife Sue to cancer in November.

To our Club Patrons – The Hon. Joe Hockey MP, the Hon. Anthony Roberts MP and Gordon Bray – we appreciate your support and hope that we can continue our association and engagement with you.

To our Sponsors for both seniors and juniors, we sincerely appreciate your contributions, which are vital to an essentially amateur Club. We hope that the association has been of benefit to your businesses.

I want to sincerely thank my Board colleagues – Luke McCormack, Blake Walker and Nick Giacomini – for their contribution and support during the season. We all had the overall Club as our priority. It was a pleasure to work with them and I enjoyed their company.

In conclusion, I want to thank the Golden Oldies for asking me to be their representative for the past 3 years, and to the Club for the opportunity of serving as Secretary for a year and as President for the last two years. The Club has been, and will continue to be a significant and enjoyable part of my life.

Finally, I wish the Club and the incoming Board members every success for our future.

Hunters Hill "Mostyn & Kellaway Shields" - Eligibility

The "Andrew Mostyn" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The "Ian Kellaway" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the "Andrew Mostyn" shield becomes ineligible for the "Ian Kellaway" and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

Hunters Hill "Club Shields" - Criteria

- 1. The Shield is awarded to the team which finishes the highest in its division during the regular season ie. before commencement of play-off rounds.
- 2. In the event that two or more teams finish in the same highest position eg. first, the winner is the team that earns the maximum percentage of competition (win/draw) points which are available to them during the regular season. Note: this excludes any bonus point system. The maximum points available may vary depending on the number of teams in the competition draw therefore a review of the competition size is required to ensure that maximum points available from actual matches played ie. excluding byes, are the only ones included. (eg a team playing in a 6 team competition may play more games than a team in an 8 team competition providing the team with a greater opportunity to gain more total points). The calculation will be the number of wins (of games actually played) divided by the number of games played. Draws shall count as ½ of a win. This should be calculated as a percentage of the total points available calculated to 2 decimal places.
- 3. In the case where two or more teams obtain the same percentage of maximum points available the winner will be determined by:
- a) The team with the highest points ratio (points for divided by points against); and if still equal
- b) The team with the highest points differential from games played (points for minus points against) and if still equal
- c) If still equal then Declare the relevant team's joint winners of Shield.

Chairman's Report - Juniors 2014

After starting registrations in February getting that organised, teams sorted and graded the season started off with a bang at the NSW Rugby Club and the season launch. This year the launch was a dedicated whole club function with the monies going to the board and the finalising of the B3 project. The launch was again organised by Luke Mc Cormack and was a great success raising enough money to finish the fence on B3.

2014 saw Hunters Hill Juniors numbers down slightly from the previous years but still managing to get a healthy 385 boys playing Rugby from the Under 6's to 16's

The following is a report from the Minis Coordinator Carolyn Swindell

The 2014 HHJRU Minis had 12 teams competing in two competitions this year, in the Inner West and Gordon competitions.

We had two teams in U6, 3 in U7, 4 in U8 and 3 in U9 age groups. More than 120 boys and girls supported by a dozen coaches and 15 managers, all of whom have jobs and commitments that they juggle to ensure the kids have a great season.

We trialled Friday night games with Roseville and Sunday games with Killara West Pymble and parent feedback has indicated that the occasional Sunday works but Friday night doesn't. The Friday night games for minis won't be a feature of the competition in 2015.

We thank the coaches and managers for their time in supporting comp but would really like to see a greater focus on parent volunteering in 2015 - each week we need arms and legs to get games on the ground and the more assistance we have, the better then experience is for everyone.

The end of the season saw each age group focusing on the skills they'll need to move into the next age group and I'm sure that will only enhance their enjoyment of the game in years to come. Big thanks to the coaches for their commitment to their own development as coaches and to creating a safe and happy environment for all the kids.

We would love to have more teams in 2015 and ask everyone to spread the word of what a fantastic club we have here and let's get more boys and girls wearing the Black and White in 2015.CS







Colts Robertson Cup Report 2014

greatness on and off the field. I believe that it has worked as you can tell by the interactions between all the players from all the grades, and the young men of the Hoops are ready to take the next step forwards.


But what I found most about the colts of 2014 was how they inspired me with their selflessness, courage and skills and I thank them all for an amazing journey.


