#### **CLUB PRESIDENTS REPORT – SEASON 2018**

#### **Presidents Report**

2018 was the 126<sup>th</sup> year of this great club, and again HHRUFC proved itself an important part of the fabric of community rugby in Australia.

Following the highs of 2017, the realities of running a community club were apparent early in the year, and I want to pay tribute to the amazing set of players, supporters and volunteers who make everything we enjoy possible. In addition – I want to highlight that our valued sponsors are integral to us putting players on the paddock, and to them I say thank you and express my gratitude for their generous support.

Results on the field in 2018 were mixed, but I personally saw how the depth of character of this club overcame many of the challenges presented, and how that character provided a strong platform for the future.

I am highly optimistic about the future of the proud and ancient club!

**HH Seniors** had a challenging year. Based on the preparation - the promotion to Kentwell was a step too far, and unfortunately the club was ill-equipped to compete in the initial stages of the competition. Kentwell Cup is a competition of extremely high standard – requiring depth and breadth. The step up from Barraclough is significant.

After some initial troubling results across the grades, the club rallied to have a very positive second half of the season, and the statistic that impresses me the most is that in 6 of our last 7 games in First Grade- we were leading at halftime. We were competitive, but our depth cost us in those tight situations.

Despite all of this – the clubs spirit was never broken, and it is important to recognize the sensational season had by the **COLTS** side. Shaded by a very strong Mosman side in the Grand Final, I want to call out the great work done by Greg Wyatt-Spratt, Mark Ashurst and Rod Dufficy in pulling together a terrific group of players – who we hope to take into grade and will help us build our future. I also want to recognize **Ben Rooney** – who was awarded the prestigious Subbies Colt of the Year! I also want to thank **Clint Allardice** and all of the other coaches and Managers that supported the club and players in 2019. Their dedication to task was unwavering!

As we look to 2019, I am excited to be part of the Senior Club and look forward to seeing a strong return to Barraclough.



Our **HHRUFC Women's Rugby** side – entered their second season in 2018 continued to go from strength to strength. They competed well in a number of tournaments and were good enough to beat some of the Shute Shield women's sides. The high point was winning the Div 2 Chatswood tournament – and to see the joy on the players faces after winning the final was amazing.

I encourage the club and 2019 Board to seriously consider making Women's Rugby as the official fourth arm of the club. While this will require a constitutional overhaul – the women players of our club have established themselves as a true force, and I believe they need an equal seat at the table in running the club!

**The Junior Club** had a very successful year – once again maintaining their registrations in a very competitive market and posting some excellent results on the field.

The committee continues to work hard together to provide an excellent offering to all players and parents, and it was encouraging to see continued investment in coaching. This is critical in providing both a stimulating and fun environment for our players – and ensure that they choose rugby as their number one code.

As you will see in Adam's annual report, the club continues to produce many representative players at District, Zone, Sydney and National Level, and also delivers premierships in the Sydney wide competition.

I was immensely proud to see three of my former HH players make the 2018 Australian Schoolboys Tour of Ireland and Scotland, with **Angus Bell** (Captain), **Will Harris**, and **Vinnie Creagh** all achieving the pinnacle of schoolboy rugby.

There is no question that Boronia Park continues to be one of the best possible nurseries for Junior Rugby in Australia

**Girls Rugby** continues to flourish in the HH Juniors Club – and I want to congratulate Adam and his committee for sponsoring the access they provide for girls to play rugby. The club should be very proud of the Flamingoes and all they have achieved this year....

The **HHRUFC Cats** – continue to provide all forms of support to the club and are integral to the fabric of the club. The Life Members/Honour Caps day was a highlight – and the 'Cat Catering' was excellent. I encourage the Cats to continue their ongoing support – and look for opportunities to hand-on their decades/centuries of experience to the rest of the club!

#### Hunters Hill "Mostyn & Kellaway Shields" - Eligibility

The "Andrew Mostyn" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The "Ian Kellaway" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the "Andrew Mostyn" shield becomes ineligible for the "Ian Kellaway" and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

#### Hunters Hill "Club Shields" - Criteria

- 1. The Shield is awarded to the team which finishes the highest in its division during the regular season ie. before commencement of play-off rounds.
- 2. In the event that two or more teams finish in the same highest position eg. first, the winner is the team that earns the maximum percentage of competition (win/draw) points which are available to them during the regular season. Note: this excludes any bonus point system. The maximum points available may vary depending on the number of teams in the competition draw therefore a review of the competition size is required to ensure that maximum points available from actual matches played ie. excluding byes, are the only ones included. (eg a team playing in a 6 team competition may play more games than a team in an 8 team competition providing the team with a greater opportunity to gain more total points). The calculation will be the number of wins (of games actually played) divided by the number of games played. Draws shall count as ½ of a win. This should be calculated as a percentage of the total points available calculated to 2 decimal places.
- 3. In the case where two or more teams obtain the same percentage of maximum points available the winner will be determined by:
- a) The team with the highest points ratio (points for divided by points against); and if still equal
- b) The team with the highest points differential from games played (points for minus points against) and if still equal
- c) If still equal then Declare the relevant team's joint winners of Shield.

2018 has been a great year for Hunters Hill Rugby. Try Rugby has maintained its strong numbers with over 40 players aged 3-5 just starting with Hunters Hill Rugby, under the Stewardship of Greg Wyatt-Spratt.

We have implemented girls touch on a Friday night this season which see's 35+ girls playing in internal touch. Our number of teams in the mini's is 13 (14 if we count the Pink Flamingo's) in 2018. We still have some work to do to strengthen some age groups, but it's a work In progress.

Our junior rugby has 9 sides and is building strongly in the under 10's- 12's again and we are confident we will field an under 15 and 16 side next season. 

# FRIDAY NIGHT GIRLS TOUCH REPORT

The inaugural year of Friday night touch for girls saw 33 girls register for to play. Throughout the season we had a few more girls come and play and some girls drop off. Friday night was chosen so as not to compete with other sports/activities the girls played: soccer, dancing, netball. However there was a Friday night netball comp meaning some girls who wanted to play couldn't. Despite the \$100 active grant from NSW state govt, most girls were already playing netball or soccer and so used it for that.

Most girls who registered to play were Sisters of existing HHJRU players; Friends of the HHJRU community or Friends of friends

To help introduce the format of the game to the girls and the basic skills (positions, rules, passing, catching, team support) - a training session was run prior to the main competitive games. The Friday night format was 5.30pm start for skills and drills training, then 6.10pm competitive games. The girls were split into 2 groups: girls aged 6-9 (approximately 20 players) and girls aged 10 -13 (approximately 13 players). Kingston ran the skills and drill training with the help of the parents. Parents were encouraged to get involved at the training session, quite a few mums supported helping with passing and running drills. Then during the competitive games, Adam Latham took the older girls group whilst Kingston took the younger girl group. During the games the parents volunteered to coach younger teams on the field. A referee with whistle helped the girls to follow the rules. The season kicked-off in May (Term 2 of school) and planned to run for one term. Due to popularity and interest, the season was extended to the end of Term 3 and finish with the regular club season.

As the season progressed the girls picked up the game quickly. The introduction of bibs to distinguish competitive sides, really helped. Introducing a winning side, and 'Player of the Day' trophy also helped. Similarly, forming permanent sides for the younger girls meant that they had to play as a team and form stronger relationships. Towards the end of the season, the more capable girls wanted to test themselves further. For the younger girls it meant playing against the boys. For the older girls it meant playing contact against other girls. Quite a few older girls wanted to play tackle, but not against the boys teams.

It was a good test and learn for the inaugural year. 2019 will need more organisation and formality to bring more numbers in.

# TREASURERS REPORT

#### **P&L Commentary**

In 2018 HHJRFC recorded an operating surplus of \$ 29,982 (2017: \$27,695) compared to a budgeted "loss" of \$ (920).

- Surplus was similar to 2017 but significantly ahead of budget as a result of;
- Net Registration fees (after affiliation fees, insurance etc) \$3,133 over budget
- Canteen surplus \$10,882 better than budget
- Additional sponsorship of \$6,000 being Juniors share of the Bayview all of club sponsorship (\$3,500) and sponsorship contribution to Bledisloe at Boronia event (\$2,500)

There were a number of expense categories where we were under budget, with total expenses (excluding canteen and registration costs) being \$ 9,672 under budget, including:

- Equipment purchases \$5,884 below budget
- Website \$2,228 below budget

#### Canteen

The canteen was once again a major contributor to our surplus with a profit of \$25,182 compared to budget of \$14,300 (and prior year of \$18,539). There were more major events than expected when budgeting (including 3 Dufficy Cup's) that contributed to the stellar performance in 2018 – thank you Bonnie once more.

The canteen gross margin was 48% (2017: 40 %), and well in excess of budget. I think it is relevant to note that the canteen operation will change in 2019 with more paid casual staff that will impact the profitability.

#### **Sponsorship**

In addition to our share (\$3,500) of the Bayview all of club sponsorship, plus a \$2,500 sponsorship of the Bledisloe event from Gladesville Orthodontics we received \$32,600 in committed sponsorship funds, being the final year of a 3 year contractual commitment. Included in the sponsorship agreement is a commitment to purchase training jerseys out of these sponsorship funds each year at a cost of approximately \$11,000.

We are currently seeking sponsors for the next 3 year period being 2019-2021. We believe we have locked in McGrath as our major sponsor again, together with Jaycar and also On Deck as a new sponsor. We are still seeking to finalise additional sponsorship.

#### **Rugby Operations**

The total operating costs excluding canteen in 2018 was \$81,097 (2017: \$86,417) compared to a budget of \$102,820. This does not however compare like with like as in 2018 our registration fees were received from SJRU net of registration and affiliate fees as well as player insurance. Excluding these registration related costs, we incurred expenses of \$77,148 (2017: \$70,939) versus budget of \$86,820. Against budget we were down on expenditure, mainly in reduced equipment purchases and reduced expenditure on the website. In 2019 we will need to purchase more equipment that in past two years and also, with new sponsors, we will need to order new playing jerseys for all teams at a cost circa. \$20,000.

The cash balance at end of year is \$307K, an increase of approximately \$34K in the year. Against this we have some commitments totalling some \$5K for our GST liability and about \$17K of creditors that were not paid prior to year-end. Included in these creditors are amounts due to Hunters Hill Council for ground hire and lighting fees that the club is disputing with HHC.

#### **Community Facility**

The Junior Committee met in September and approved a commitment of \$150,000 for the construction of the community facility at Boronia Park, conditional on the successful tenure application to Hunters Hill Council. The funds will be provided when the project has all necessary approvals and is due to be constructed. Final sign off for payment will be taken to the HHJRFC committee meeting for approval.




Minis player numbers consistent with last year

In 2018 the NSW Government introduced an Active Kids Rebate of \$100 per child per year. This year registration fees were increased:





### **HHRUFC - THE ARCHIVE COMMITTEE (TAC)**

In March this year TAC members met to discuss 'WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?'

The agenda for this meeting was based on looking at our archiving activities, taking a look at what we were doing and why.

TAC celebrates its 10th year of activity on 24 November and started with enthusiasm involving a small group of members. There is uncertainty about these members continuing. While not being able to guarantee that our current few active members will continue we also can't guarantee that our premises at Henley will be there long term, or can't guarantee that if the 'clubroom' does eventuate, that there will be space for the amount of material we have accumulated.

We appreciate that the Club supports TAC by the Board funding our annual rental for the Henley premises. We also acknowledge the generous donations of CATS members over the years. However, our attempts to engage people in our work have not been all that successful eg, B2B displays and getting people to come down to Henley. We think they want it, and we think that what we do is important, but they don't. Maybe we are dated in our thinking. Brian Robertson has looked at other Clubs such as Mosman, Colleagues and Petersham and can find no evidence of detailed archives. Those Club's Annual Reports are either not published or are only about 15pages of information. Ron Whites effort in putting together our Annual Report is time consuming and frustrating in trying to collect the various reports and photos which go into the report. Despite all this work you ask the question - How widely read is our Annual Report?

The meeting agreed that we needed to aggressively cull any material that was not of 'historical importance to our Club'. This has been started and we are scanning the material that is considered of historical importance to our laptop and backing this up to an external hard drive – the culled material and items that have been scanned are disposed of. When this is completed we have to consider what to do with physical items that we hold. We plan to offer duplicate/triplicate copies of scanned photos to the Hunters Hill Historical Society. The 'fate' of other items, such as blazers, framed photos and the like will have to be considered based on their historical importance.

We still have plenty of work in front of us to be in a position to share the retained and remaining relevant material by handing a hard drive of material to future Club officials.
