Hunters Hill "Mostyn & Kellaway Shields" - Eligibility

The "Andrew Mostyn" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season of the junior AND senior clubs combined.

The "Ian Kellaway" Shield is awarded to the best performing, competitive team in the regular season in the junior club.

Teams eligible to participate in the Shields are teams registered with the Hunters Hill Rugby Union Football Club or Hunters Hill Junior Rugby Union Football Club involved in any full season, outdoor winter rugby competition administered by NSW Subbies or SJRU. (ie for juniors only includes from U10 and above)

Teams are eligible to only win one shield each season – ie the team that wins the "Andrew Mostyn" shield becomes ineligible for the "Ian Kellaway" and it shall be awarded to the next qualified team.

Seniors President's Report 2023

This year has been a hugely successful year for HHRUFC. On any score – it is clear that the Hillies are now comfortable in their Division One Kentwell Cup 'skin' and have become a force in Women's Rugby in Sydney.

The Men's Senior club had an outstanding year – coming second in the Division One Club Championship and reaching their second consecutive Kentwell Cup Grand Final. Player numbers were good across the grades, and a highlight was a strong colts' program that delivered two teams.

The Club can be very proud that it was awarded Division One Club of the Year for 2023 at the recent Subbies AGM, and our Women won the Spirit of Rugby Award in the Sydney Women's Rugby Awards event in September.

A few highlights across the grades:

First Grade - Despite the heartbreaking loss in the final moments of what could be considered one of the best Kentwell deciders ever – our First-Grade side should be incredibly proud of their Minor Premiership, as well as their second appearance in a decider. Thank you to Jock Stanley for his first year at the club, and to Jake Henwood in his debut year of coaching Senior Rugby. Also big thanks to the steadying hand of Ross Reynolds who continues to contribute to the success of the club. I am confident that the First-Grade squad will be resilient and focused enough to drive a successful campaign in 2024.

Second Grade - Our 2nd Grade side came 3rd in the Burke cup for the second year running – suffering a tough loss against Drummoyne in the Final. The team were competitive all year, and the core of key players will be an important part of ensuring we are successful in 2024. Thanks goes to Graham 'Stokesy' Stokes who has led this grade for three years running. He is a true clubman of HH now!

Colts – The Colties had a great year, but probably feel disappointed with the end results. The HH Colts team came fourth after the Home and Away competition but did not progress to finals due to win differential. Despite some amazing rugby – they could not produce the consistency required to press hard in the Barbour Cup. The real surprise packet was the HH/Epping Joint Venture. After a poor start – the team galvanised and produced some grinding rugby – and made the semi-finals, only to be knocked out in



week one by UNSW. Thanks to Ronnie White and Rod Dufficy – whom I had the pleasure of coaching and partnering with and have ensured we have a strong setup for 2024, as well as a strong set of graduates into grade for next year.

Third Grade - A tough year for the Whiddon Cup team – as a slow start and lots of new players meant that the team struggled to find consistency. It was not until round 8 that the team posted a win, but the team came home strong and has some important building blokes for next year. A highlight was beating table topping Drummoyne at home at Boronia on the bell – and it should that this team really left a lot on the table. Thanks to new coach Billy Hicks who will be better for the experience at HH.

Fourth Grade – Despite a solid core – the Judd Cup team also struggled for consistency and was ultimately disappointed with their season. Player availability and juggling of numbers meant that coach Jason Gaff had a hard job to produce a consistent team each week. But it is fair to say that this did not give up in any game and should look forward to brighter days in 2024.

Women's Rugby – This was a tremendous story about resilience and persistence. The Women's rugby program was hurt by a high level of turnover in their playing ranks from 2022 – but build strong momentum through the season and were ultimately rewarded with Fourth Place and a semi-finals birth in the Jack Scott Division Two Competition. The girls went down to a strong Burraneer side in the semi but should be extremely proud of their year! They were awarded the 2023 Spirit of Rugby Award at the Sydney Women's Rugby Union Awards night – which is true reflection of how great our Women's Club has become.

So, while some big trophies eluded us in 2023 – the Club has stamped itself as a powerhouse of suburban rugby in 2023. I would like to thank our major Sponsors - The Bayview Hotel and BlueBet for their support, as well as our many other generous supporters (such as Pickles, Ryde MG, URM) as without your support – we would not be able to support our young men and women in their endeavours.

Planning is well underway for Season 2024 – with all Coaches and Sponsors appointed, and a new apparel supplier. The club has a lot to be optimistic about as we close out 2023 and head into 2024, not least of which moving into our new clubhouse. I am excited!!

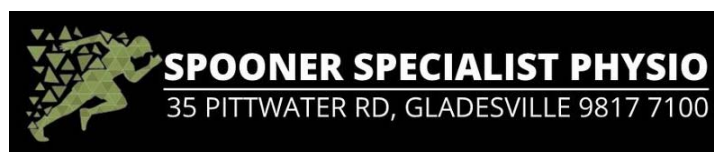

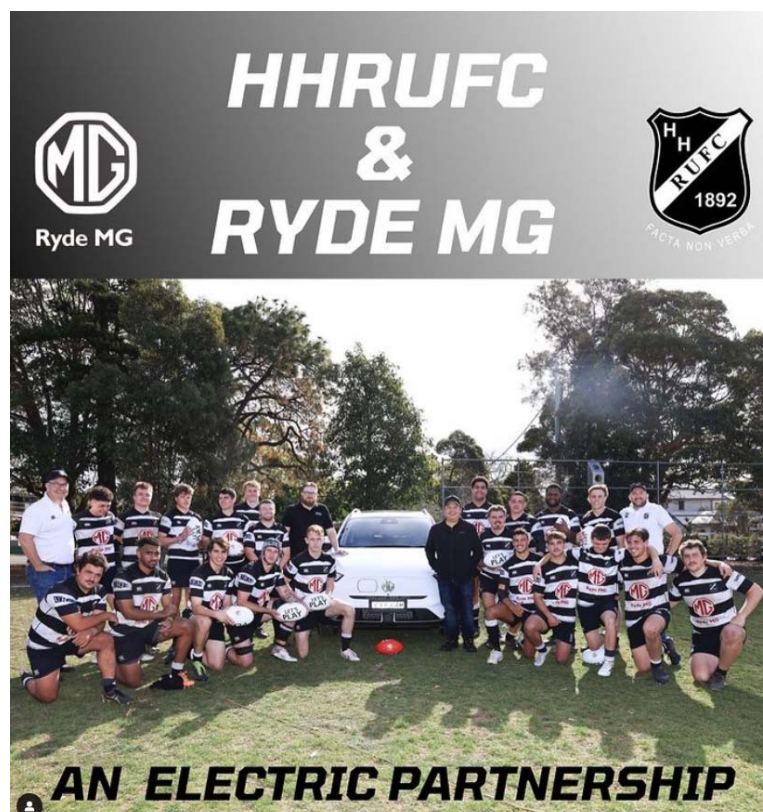

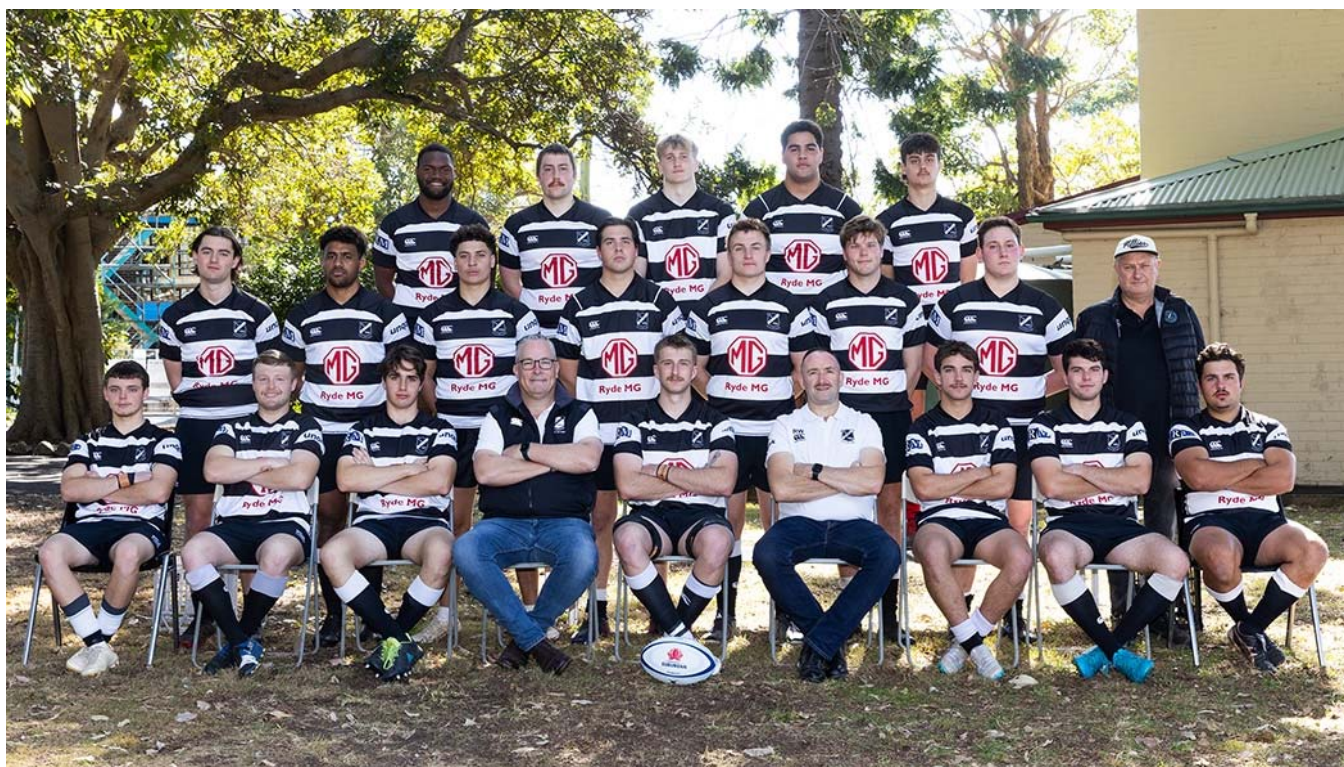

The team rallied together in game 3 but rugby was second in everyone's minds.

Next up was the Subbies 7's tournament which became a 3 way trial at UNSW. 8 of our ladies played their 1st ever game of rugby, all instant rugby tragics! Hunters Hill dominated the day, while also lending players to the other teams to help make sure the day was a success.

We made the 'brave' decision to commit to the new Jack Scott Division 2 -10's comp, a new format for the team. We played our 1st ever 10's game in a trial v a strong Sydney Uni squad and everyone was then hooked on the format.

Three more trials followed, unfortunately seeing season ending knee injuries to Ali Quinn & Carrie Edgar. We welcomed Stu Ryan to the coaching team, along with Alex Bellamy who was also elected Club Captain. Karissa Kuka took over as Women's Vice Chair.

After a monster preseason, the team was eager to hit the 10s season proper. We started with a convincing win v Petersham, followed by a narrow loss in a cracking game v Two Blues. 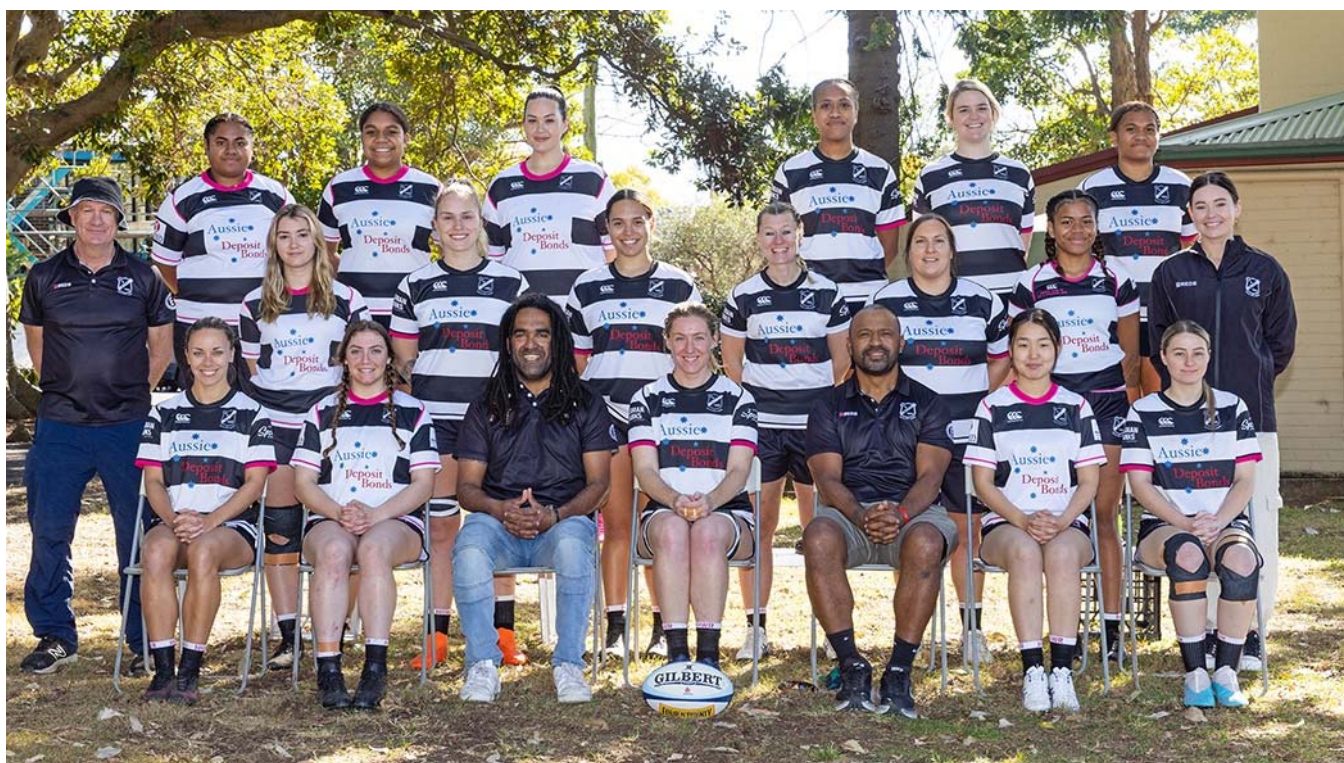

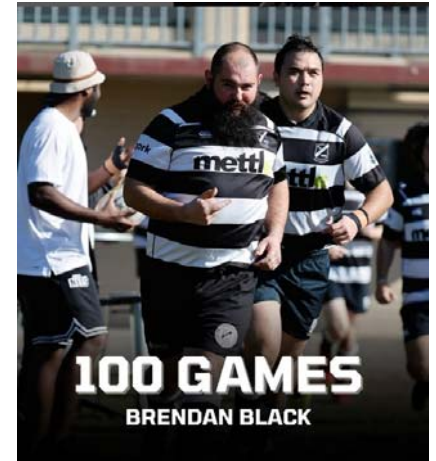

Join us next year for an Eastwood reprise, new jerseys and even more aging superstars reliving the glory of the game they play in Heaven.

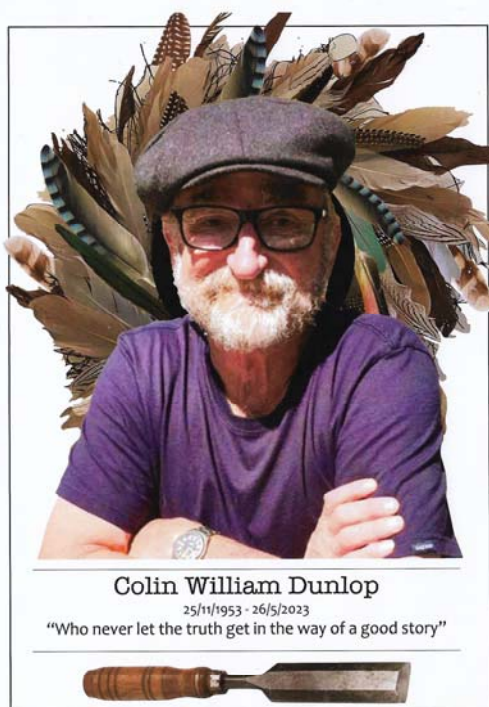

JG epitomised everything that is good about rugby. This year he was recognised by the Club, naming the 5th Grade "Spirit of Rugby" award in his honour.

The last couple of years were pretty tough but in typical JG fashion he never wanted any sympathy.

I'll leave the last word to his great mate Roscoe, 'I said my goodbyes a couple of days ago and reminded him of the \$10 he borrowed in 1978. He pretended not to hear. Vale Johnny and save me a seat in Heaven's pub.'

Bruce was the type of fellow who makes Hunters Hill Rugby tick - solid clubman, a committed player and coach and just an all-round good bloke.

He will be sadly missed.

Well, what an introduction that was.

Ronnie became a senior member as a player in the 1992 centenary year. In his first season age 18, he was selected in the Presidents XV vs Combined Sub-District XV Centenary match, made his 1st grade debut, won a 2nd Grade Stockdale Cup premiership, was in the cast of the last of the famous HHRUFC review shows and awarded the club's Best New Back award. From then he has won 4 premierships, 3 Runners up, been a coach, manager, administrator, and twice clubman of the year. He has played in every senior grade in NSW Sub Districts top 3 divisions.

Ron's commitment to the Club's history is evident through his role as a founding member of The Archive Committee (TAC), dedicated to preserving the Club's rich past.
